Public Health Emergency Grant

- What it offers
 - Up to \$75K to nonprofits and small businesses
 - •First \$10 million awarded in grants of \$10K or less
 - 25% set aside for restaurants and retail
 - Additional \$2500 for teleworking costs, if eligible

Requirements

- •100 or fewer full-time employees
- •Based in County—50% of revenue or 50% of employees in Montgomery County
- •Show 50% loss in March 2020 compared to monthly average
- Must be eligible for large grant to apply for teleworking funds
